#### Pleased to meet you!

It is with great joy that I welcome you to our 2017–2018 season, the Prince George's Philharmonic's 52<sup>nd</sup> and my *first* season as music director! Continuing the Philharmonic's tradition of performing great repertoire, this season is as extraordinary and exciting as it is diverse—and we mark some important anniversaries.

We open and close this first season together with two complementary fanfares, like bookends: Aaron Copland's Fanfare for the Common Man and Joan Tower's Fanfare for an Uncommon Woman. We also begin and end with two monumental Russian works: Tchaikovsky's Fourth Symphony (also based on an opening fanfare) marks the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death. Whereas Tchaikovsky's music is steeped in Czarist Russia, Shostakovich's Fifth Symphony is inextricably associated with the Soviet Union,

formed 100 years ago. Copland's music returns with El Salon México in an all-American program that celebrates our diversity and observes the 50th anniversary of the deaths of Martin Luther King, Jr. and Robert F. Kennedy with African-American composers William Grant Still and Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, as well as William Schuman and Samuel Barber. We celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of another American icon, Leonard Bernstein, with his exuberant Candide Overture, and with his Chichester Psalms in collaboration with the talented young musicians of Suitland High School (Kenneth Boucher, Director) in our continuing commitment to education and the community. That program begins with a side-by-side performance of music from Bizet's ever-popular Carmen and ends with more great American music: five Jazz classics with renowned woodwind artist Chris Vadala, director of Jazz Studies at the University of Maryland. We observe the 150th anniversary of Rossini's death with the overture to his popular opera Semiramide, and the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Czech Republic with two great Czech composers from two different centuries: Dvořák's festive Carnival Overture, and Martinu's gorgeous Rhapsody Concerto with violist Victoria Chiang (last season we performed Brahms' Double Concerto with her Aspen Trio partners, David Perry and Michael Mermagen). Capping that program, Brahms' Third Symphony marks the 120th anniversary of his death. Mezzo-soprano Laura Zuiderveen, returns with another Mahler performance, the intimate Rückert Lieder (she performed the Resurrection Symphony with the Philharmonic in 2016), and pianist Yuliya Gorenman makes her first appearance with the Philharmonic with Beethoven's majestic Emperor Concerto.

We all look forward to sharing this great season with you — don't miss a single performance! *Please join us for the celebration!*

#### **EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH & SYMPHONY KIDS**

The Anne Gentry Educational Outreach Program provides free music instruction to deserving Prince George's County public school students who would otherwise be unable to engage in such instruction. Students in the Anne Gentry Educational Outreach Program, also known as "Symphony Kids", receive one-on-one music lessons with a qualified teacher during the school year and free tickets for their families to attend all Philharmonic concerts. In addition, our educational outreach program offers an annual side-by-side for selected students, occasional masterclasses led by our guest artists, and an annual celebration of Music in Our Schools.
